MPP Advising Notes

The MPP coursework is divided into four core Elements:

- *Practice*
- *Analysis*
- *Governance*
- *Economics*

For each element, students must complete one core course, and add a secondary course from a pre-approved list of electives to satisfy program requirements.

Full-time vs. Part-time:

- Full-time students must be enrolled in a minimum of nine credits (three courses) per semester and can typically complete the program in two academic years.
- Part-time students typically enroll in six credits (two courses) per semester and complete the program in three academic years.

Suggested Course Sequence:

- All students should plan to take *PUBP 500: Theory and Practice in Public Policy* during their first semester (no later than the second semester).

- All students should plan to take POGO 511 in their first two semesters in the program. To enroll in 511, students must complete a statistics screening exam. Exams can be taken during a scheduled exam date or completed at the conclusion of the Statistics Workshop (optional). The screening exam can be taken multiple times. If you do not pass the first time, you are welcome to retake it on another test date or register for the workshop. There is no cost associated with the screening exam. For more information, please visit: schar.gmu.edu/511. POGO 511 – Introductory Data Analysis for Policy and Government is a prerequisite for Methods/Analytics core courses.
- It is strongly recommended that all or most of the required core coursework be completed prior to a student participating in an internship.
- Please note: A few core courses are typically offered in the summer term.
- All students must complete PUBP 555: Economics Math Workshop before taking PUBP 720: Managerial Economics and Policy Analysis.

Study Abroad Opportunities:

- Any SCHAR-sponsored study abroad course may count as an elective toward *any* area of emphasis.
- Unless prior written permission is obtained, students may apply only one study abroad course (three credits) toward graduation. For more information, please visit: abroad.gmu.edu

Professional Internship:

- Students with less than two years of public policy oriented work experience are required to complete a professional internship. - International students should not wait until their last term to complete an internship for academic credit. Obtaining an internship is not guaranteed. As an internship is required for the MPP program, the inability to complete this requirement before graduation could jeopardize degree completion and visa status.

Academic Requirements:

- Students must maintain a minimum 3.0 cumulative grade point average to graduate.
- Students may apply up to six credits of “C” toward graduation.
- A student is terminated from the Schar School if he/she receives a grade of “F” in a single course and/or a grade of “C” in nine or more credits.
- Students must complete all MPP requirements within *six years* of the date of initial enrollment as a degree-seeking student.

Areas of Emphasis/Elective Courses:

- Students may choose one of emphasis areas listed below. With prior written approval from the academic advisor, students have the option to design their own emphasis area.

 - o Education Policy

 - o National Security and Public Policy

- Of the four elective courses comprising the area of emphasis, *at least one* must have an international focus.
- Elective courses should not be taken until a student has completed a minimum of nine credits of required coursework. Elective courses are offered year round (fall, spring and summer) but not every section is offered every semester.
- **All non-SCHAR courses have to be pre-approved by your academic advisor before registering. Students can enroll in up to two electives (including consortium courses) outside of SCHAR, with prior approval.** PhD level courses and/or foreign language courses are *not* permissible elective options.

- Based upon a review of academic transcripts, MPP students may be required to take PUBP 730: US National Policy Systems & Theory and/or POGO 570: Policy Writing Fundamentals as part their emphasis electives.
 - Additionally, all MPP students will take a writing assessment during the introductory PUBP 500 course. Based on this assessment, students may be required to take POGO 570 to strengthen their writing skills.

- Please see the list below for examples of the types of SCHAR elective courses that can be used to fulfill each emphasis area.
- SCHAR “special topics” courses are noted as PUBP 710, GCP 701, or POGO 550 & 750. Students may take multiple special topics courses as long as the titles are different and the course is relevant to the chosen emphasis area.
- Please note: this is NOT an all-inclusive course inventory. Rather, this list is provided to illustrate the kind of electives SCHAR typically offers. Any student interested in an elective course not listed below should contact his/her advisor for prior approval. Approval is contingent upon the relevance of the selected course to the student’s emphasis area.
